Manu Aluli Meyer is the fifth daughter of Emma Aluli and Harry Meyer. She is part of a larger 'ohana who hail from Mokapu, Kailua, Kamamalu, Wailuku, Hilo, Kohala and Kipahulu. Her family is dedicated to the transformation of Hawai'i via kānaka cultural ideas with land, health, education, economics, publishing, art, law, justice, and philosophy. Dr. Aluli Meyer earned her doctorate from Harvard in 1998 thinking through Hawaiian epistemology and its role in world-wide awakening. She remains a staunch advocate of cultural agroforestry with her focus on niu, or coconuts, and has been a haku ho'oponopono most of her adult life. Aunty Manu is now part of UH West O'ahu and lives in the mauka lands of Palehua with her beloved partner, Ngahiraka Mason.
