PURPOSE:

To extend the Provisional Status for the Master of Arts in Heritage Management (HRMA) at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo for one year, to Fall 2018.

BACKGROUND:

Per RP 5.201 B. Provisional Programs, "Campuses may request and the President or designee may grant an extension for one year for provisional programs." We are requesting an extension of the provisional status of the MA, Heritage Management degree for one year until Fall 2018.

The Heritage Management program is run on a cohort model and currently accepts students every other year. They have just recently admitted its second cohort after graduating members of its first cohort in Spring 2017. The program would like to include outcomes and data from the first two cohorts in the provisional to established report.
