

ANTI-STIGMA VIDEO PROJECT

Did you know that students sometimes feel too embarrassed to seek help for their mental health concerns? They are often challenged by the stigmatizing attitudes that result from misconceptions about mental illnesses. Students fear being judged by friends, fellow classmates, and even their professors. They also worry that they will be seen as being irresponsible, incapable, or that their mental health concern is not a serious matter.

Eligibility

All University of Hawaii at Hilo students, faculty, and staff are eligible to submit. Current students are defined as those registered for Fall 2020 courses. If a participant is under the age of eighteen (18), the parent or legal guardian must sign a separate consent form and submit consent to chps@hawaii.edu.

The sponsor reserves the right to verify the eligibility of each participant.

By participating in the project, each individual agrees to abide by these eligibility requirements.

Consent Form

The consent will be the first section of the Google form (link to url). Both primary and secondary participants must consent to the use of the photo or creative design that is being submitted in order for it to be featured in the video project.

Model Release

By participating in the anti-stigma video project, each participant grants Sponsors permission to use their likeness in all sponsor-authorized print or online productions.

By participating, each participant waives any right they may have to inspect and approve the finished product.

Indemnification & Release

By participating in the anti-stigma video project, each participant agrees to indemnify, release or hold harmless sponsors from any liability, damages, losses, or injury resulting in whole or in part, directly or indirectly, from that individual's participation in the anti-stigma video project.

By participating, each individual grants Sponsor permission to use his/her entry in the anti-stigma video project for publicity purposes without payment.

By participating, each participant agrees:

- Participants must ensure that they own the undisputed copyright to their respective entries.
- Image copyright remains the property of the photographer even though permission to use imagery is given to UH Hilo by participation in the project.
- By entering the anti-stigma video project, participants agree that their images/creative piece will remain a part of UH Hilo history and may be used for future event promotions.
