

The library assesses the competencies in information literacy through the use of online library programs used by almost all English 100 classes, as well as student and faculty surveys. English 100 classes are taught information literacy skills through Lulima, the UH system's course management system. Librarians created a program with modules and quizzes that students are assigned to complete as homework. In these classes, a pretest is administered as a benchmark during the first session and a final quiz is given to test student learning during a second session. Scores are sent to instructors, who generally incorporate the library assignment into their final course grades. This ongoing assessment information is reviewed regularly and used to improve the library's instruction program. In the past year (2013-2014), the library provided information literacy instruction sessions for 37 UHH ENG 100 classes.
